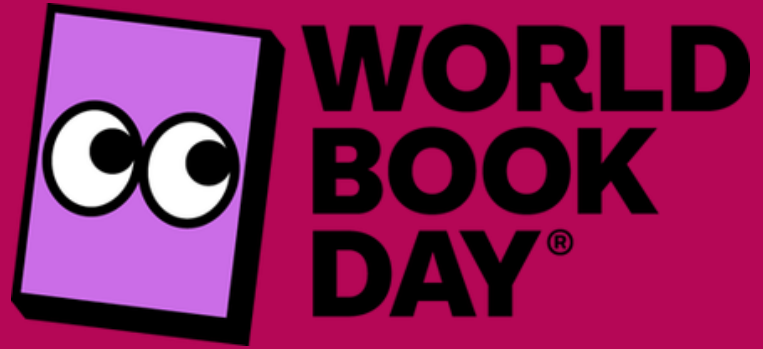


CEAT NEWS

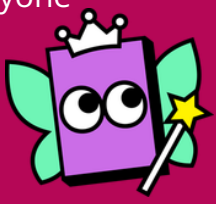
HIGHAM LANE NORTH
